## Your Excellency,

We are writing to express our serious concern regarding the violent attack perpetrated by Bengali settlers against the indigenous inhabitants of Sa Prue Para, Joysen Para, Chakra Karbari Para and Nua Para villages in Mahalchari sub-district of Khagrachari Hill District on 3 April 2006. We are deeply shocked and angered to learn that two young Marma women were cruelly gang raped by the settlers. A Buddhist orphanage and many homes were ransacked, and some 30 indigenous people were injured, several of them critically, in the settlers' attempt to grab land. It is particularly disturbing to note that the personnel of the Nuapara Arms Police Battalion Camp, located only about 200 yards from the area of the incident, did nothing to stop the attack, and were seen at the scene of the crime.

This incident has occurred in the context of intensified illegal grabbing of indigenous peoples' lands by Bengali settlers in the region:

- More than 115 houses have been built on some 100 acres of titled indigenous land in the nearby Gamaridhala area, allegedly with the assistance and protection of local military forces.
   Promises by military authorities to withdraw the houses remain unimplemented.
- The Buddha Shishu Ghar orphanage has lost almost all of its titled land to illegal land grabbing.
- On March 4<sup>th</sup>, several indigenous residents involved in non-violent protests against this land grabbing were severely beaten and arrested by army personnel. The next day, military barged into the Khagrachari court, escorted two of them outside, placed firearms in their hands and took false photos of them. They remain in police custody, facing false charges of illegal weapons possession.

How can Bangladesh seek a seat on the UN Human Rights Council when its own human rights situation is in such disorder? How long must the indigenous peoples of the Chittagong Hill Tracts suffer in silence as they are robbed of their lands, lives, and dignity with total impunity, under the very noses of the security forces purportedly there to protect them? Must Bangladesh repeat the crimes that the white men perpetrated against the indigenous peoples of the Americas, or the Japanese against the Ainu people? Should not a nation that fought so nobly to safeguard its own language and identity, also respect the wishes of indigenous peoples to maintain their own way of life?

We strongly urge the government to immediately take the following actions to correct the injustices of this heinous incident:

1. bring to justice the perpetrators of the 3 April communal attack, particularly those involved in

the rape incident.

2. provide free treatment to the injured, compensation for damages, and protection from any

further violence or land grabbing.

the land to the indigenous land owners.

3. investigate the role of Nuapara arms police battalion in the 3 April incident, and the military

authorities in land grabbing in the Gamaridhala area. Take disciplinary/legal action against

personnel derelict in fulfilling their duties or responsible for aiding/abetting illegal activities.

4. remove the new houses built by Bengali settlers on disputed lands in Gamaridhala, and return

5. release the indigenous people arrested on March 4th and withdraw the false cases against them.

We shall bring the above issues to the attention of our government, particularly the authorities in charge of official development assistance. Any inaction on these matters will not go unnoticed.
